#### **News from the Guesthouse**

For the months of March, April, and May we provided 1,028 nights of shelter and case management for men, women and children, ages 2 to 70 years. 7 families moved into housing. As of June  $7^{\text{th}}$ , we have 10 guests with 3 waiting to move in.

In addition to caring for our guests, our House Manager helped 84 "Seekers," providing resources to people on the phone or in person, who did not come into the Guesthouse. 25 email inquiries for shelter were answered.

# **Polly's Story**

Polly (not her real name) came to St. Luke's Guesthouse in March of 2025. She had lost her apartment after losing her job and could no longer afford her rent. Before coming to St. Luke's she was staying in her car. Polly's work experience is IT administration. While an initial job didn't work out, she continued to seek employment and worked with MassHire to find work in her field.

Polly also acknowledged a drinking problem and attended AA meetings regularly while she filled out numerous housing applications. In May, she moved into a woman's sober house in Worcester. She said she was grateful for the support and guidance of the staff at the Guesthouse. She plans to continue to look for work in Worcester, adjust her budget, and save for her own apartment.

#### A View from the Staff

St. Luke's Guesthouse welcomed 5 guests in March, and then 5 more arrived in May. For a few weeks there was a diverse group of guests. We had several older women who were looking for work as well as housing. We had a young single mother and her child, 2 younger women, and a couple. All our first-floor rooms housed single men working hard to pay off debt, organize RMV issues and save money. The local Amazon warehouse in Charlton has offered job opportunities for several of our guests.

At the same time, 2 guests left because we could no longer provide services for them. It is always difficult to recognize when our model of self-sufficiency and accountability does not meet the needs of some guests and applicants. We know that there are other resources and pray that each individual finds the assistance they need.
